**M**r Justice Denis McDonald was effusive in his praise: TrialView had worked seamlessly and the test case between FBD and four publicans over business-interruption insurance policies had gone off without a hitch.

“The whole TrialView system worked very well, if I may say so. For the purposes of this case it has, I think, worked extremely well and I’m very grateful to everyone at TrialView for the way in which we were able to cooperate together to ensure that the system could work,” the judge said.

Judge McDonald’s praise for the Irish legal technology company, founded in 2015, came as little surprise to observers who had watched the platform facilitate the hybrid case, involving both evidence delivered in person and via video link, over the previous three weeks.
